

Judging Day FAQ'S

What can we expect at the Judging Day?

A busy day and fun day with plenty of networking with other women in construction & engineering from all over Europe! There is also the WICE summit which will take place concurrently with the judging process. 3 judges per panel will judge the categories throughout the day. You will be invited to give a short presentation to your assigned panel.

The Judging Process

Up to 10 MINUTES presentation to the judges Up to 15 MINUTES of questions and answers. Up to 1 MINUTE to answer "why should you win the award in your category and how would you use it to make an impact on improving equality and diversity within the construction & engineering sectors?"

The results will be announced at the awards dinner on the 26th of May 2024 at the Park Plaza Westminster, London. All finalists are required to attend the ceremony, if you are unable to attend please make sure there is a representative from your company to accept your award should you win.

How many people can attend the Judging Day Presentation?

The judging day is mainly for the finalists, the judges and the speakers however colleagues from finalist companies may attend the European Women In Construction & Engineering Summit. There is a cost of £350 + VAT to attend.

Can I receive feedback from my Presentation?

We will be running on a strict schedule however the judges will do their best to provide feedback on the score sheets. The judges' decision is final.

How long will my judging session last?

Approximately one hour.

What are the judges looking for?

Each of the categories has a defined criterion. Just as in a job application the judges are looking for evidence of how your role has contributed to your company, how you utilize your skills and how you have stayed up to date with the current changes within the construction and engineering profession. The judges will score on Involvement in & commitment to the industry, Career & education, Teamwork & leadership skills, Knowledge of workplace health & safety issues, Customer service/relations, other pursuits, hobbies & extracurricular activities.

Judges are NOT impressed with pages of marketing material. You should aim to provide measures of success and quotes from customers and senior executives from your company etc. The key question to ask yourself is "will the judges understand my presentation and appreciate what I have achieved and why I deserve to win?" If the answer is no then go back to the drawing board.

How many judges will sit on each panel?

There will be 3 judges per panel. A full list of the judges is available on the website.

Do I need to bring a laptop?

You may bring whatever device you wish to make your presentation on. We advise that you avoid presentations that may require the use of the internet as we cannot guarantee uninterrupted internet access.

Who am I up against?

A full list of category finalists is available on the awards website wisawards.com. Each entry/individual will be judged separately throughout the day.

Directions

Characterised by different atmospheres and energies, Radisson Blu Edwardian, Heathrow is a hotel and conference center conveniently located near Heathrow airport and with seamless connections to London and beyond.

BY BUS

Heathrow Hoppa Bus

The price of a single trip is £5 per adult if purchased at reception (£6 if purchased on the bus). One child aged between 5 and 15 may travel free with each accompanying adult, whilst children under 5 travel free. Please buy your ticket before travelling. Tickets are available from reception, concierge or self-service machine at the front of the hotel.

TRANSPORT FOR LONDON (TFL)

Transport for London (TFL) no longer accept cash to pay for bus fares. However, you will be able to pay with a Visitor Oyster card, Oyster card, Travelcard or UKissued contactless payment card.

BY CAR

Take junction 4 off the M4 and follow signs to Terminal 1, 2 & 3. At the roundabout, take the A4 exit on Bath Road. There are 550 car parking spaces at the hotel. The car parking rate is £16.00 per 24 hours. If using Sat Nav, enter the following postcode: UB3 5AW.

BY TRAIN

London Underground

Take the Piccadilly Line to Hatton Cross. Once there, leave the building and turn right. Go to the bus stop by the bridge and take the free 285 bus heading towards Heathrow. Ask the driver for the Radisson Blu Edwardian hotel on Bath Road. You will pass our hotel on your righthand side and then arrive at the bus stop. Please cross the road and we are a two-minute walk away. Plan your journey with London Underground's tube planner.

MAINLAND TRAIN

Heathrow Express is a fast-track train from Paddington to Terminal 1, 2, 3 & 4 and only takes approximately 15 minutes to get to/from central London. Take the Heathrow Express train to Terminals 1-3. There you can either take bus 111, 285 or 140. All of them are free. Simply ask the driver for the Radisson Blu hotel on Bath Road.
